ISBI Membership Dues

The ISBI dues include an individual subscription to *Burns* (8 issues per year) for each member. The dues structure outlined below was approved by the Executive Committee and then overwhelmingly supported by a General Assembly vote in September 2008 (the first increase since 1991). It is hoped that this dues structure will better reflect the ability of individuals to pay for the benefits of the society and will help members from less advantaged countries take advantage of the journal and the educational programs. Please be aware that an individual subscription to *Burns* now costs US \$349, so membership in the ISBI is advantageous.

Country of Origin: The World has been divided into “low” and “high” income areas, using the International Monetary Fund rankings of countries (combining the published categories “low” and “lower middle” into ISBI category low and “upper middle” and “high” into ISBI high income areas)

Profession: Physicians, PhDs, and individuals associated with industry are ranked as **Category 1** and all others ranked as **Category 2**.

The following dues structure has been established:

High Income Countries:	Category 1 individuals US \$150.00 per annum
	Category 2 individuals US \$ 75.00 per annum
Low Income Countries:	Category 1 individuals US \$ 75.00 per annum
	Category 2 individuals US \$ 50.00 per annum
